



THE SILVER DOLLAR





The Silver Dollar was owned by Antone (Tony) Santos. He arrived in the U.S. from Portugal in 1911 and he was naturalized in 1919. He worked as a laborer in the salt industry until he built a Shell Gas station on the corner of Vallejo and the Alvarado Centerville Road. Later he added the Silver Café on the corner of Watkins and the Alvarado Centerville Road.

Tony Santos married Mae Davilla and had two children, Alvina and Winifred. Alvina married Tony Brune and Winifred married William Harper.

- 1963 Joseph Seoane was "Citizen of the Year".
- **1963** City Council voted 3-1 to reject school unification.
- **1963** \$1.5 million Mobile Park approved.
- **1963** Seeger quits as City Manager, blasting empty authority of his office.
- 1963 Gail Pagan headed Decoto Board of Trustees.
- 1963 Union Plaza approved.
- 1963 Union City finished 2nd in State Little League finals.
- 1963 Alvarado 1st Western bank robbed of \$4,000.


