- **1964** Charles F. "Chuck" Kennedy became Union City's first Park and Recreation Director.
- 1964 Unification of schools failed by 369 votes.
- 1964 Pacific States Steel in fifth month of strike.
- **1964** Irv Williams won Council seat. Bernie Morales and Will Davis were also chosen.
- 1964 Will Davis selected mayor.
- **1964** Henry Franco, Norman Silivera, Aurio Nieves, Charles Maraman and John Monohan chosen as Planning Commissioners.
- 1964 (December 8) City voted 2 to 1 for unification.
- **1964** Trustees John L. Samarron, Frank J. Borghi, Jr., Gail Pagan, Elliott N. Paulsen and Stan Richards were appointed.
- 1965 New Haven Unified School District was formed.
- **1965** The City of Union City rented an industrial building at Whipple Road and Central Avenue, then moved to H Street and Decoto Road in Decoto.
- 1965 Police Department formed.
- **1965** Dr. Harold Schoenfield chosen Superintendent of Schools.
- 1965 Harry Spooner dies.
- 1965 First Western Bank hit again: took \$24,284.
- 1966 Union City Drive In opened. Six movie screens stood next to 880. Loren Pinto and his entire family were associated with the Union City Drive-In Theater from the time it opened in 1966 until it closed in 1998. Over the three decades in between, it seemed that almost all the Pinto family worked there at one time or another, tending or managing the snack bar, selling tickets, or turning away kids who tried to hide in car trunks.

- 1966 City moves to new City Hall in February.
- **1966** New post office dedicated.
- 1966 Kenneth Huck chosen as Police Chief.
- 1966 Kitayama and Leo Alvelais won council seats.
- 1966 Bernie Morales new mayor.
- 1966 Sharon Merryfield Maid of Union City.
- 1966 Constanzo development was approved.
- 1966 Nine (9) School Bond defeated.
- 1966 Irv Williams married Margaret Pfau.
- **1966** Union City expanded to 18 square miles. Hill areas annexed. Population reached 6,103.
- **1967** Rev Adam G. Lopez, Jr. served as pastor of the Union City Apostolic Church.
- **1967** James Logan's field and stadium named after Jud Taylor.
- **1967** School board hassle erupts over film "Nothing But a Man."
- **1967** Board member Rev. Elliott Paulsen's home bombed.
- 1967 Application filed for recall of Paulsen.
- **1967** Petition received sufficient signatures for recall ballot.
- **1967** Recall passed 1261 to 1232 to oust Paulsen.
- 1967 Dr. Syd Furman won vacant seat.
- 1967 Council pay hiked to \$150 a month.
- 1967 Park bond passed.
- 1968 Union Plaza opened.
- 1968 Joe Turturici named Citizen of the Year.
- 1968 Teresa Zambrano crowned Queen of Union City.
- 1968 Stella Caldeira died.
- **1968** Irv Williams re-elected, as "Shorty" Garcia and Henry Franco also got Council seats.
- 1968 Leo Alvelais elected as Mayor.

- 1968 Lynn Swift chosen Maid of Union City.
- 1968 Council approved \$1.2 million budget.
- **1968** Harold Schoenfield fired as Superintendent of Schools.
- 1968 Oscar Dowe died.
- 1968 Guy Emmanuel named acting superintendent.
- 1969 Alvarado Station torn down.
- 1969 Holly Sugar closed.
- 1969 Colleen Prette chosen Maid of Union City.
- **1969** Dr. Duane Bay picked as new Superintendent of Schools.
- **1969** Casa Verde homes opened in Alvarado.

- **1969** City Council approved SASSO housing rezoning in 3-2 vote.
- **1969** City residents circulate petition and force low-cost housing rezoning to vote.
- **1969** (July 31) City voted to override Council approval thus leaving the Baker Rd. property up in the air.
- **1969** SASSO appealed the referendum to Federal Courts.
- **1969** City hires John V. Trump as attorney to defend vote.
- 1969 Plans began for Union City Park off Decoto Rd.
- **1969** (September 11) Manuel White, one of Union City's leading citizens, died at age 74. He was Trustee of the Decoto School District from 1941 through 1957. In his honor, the Manuel White School was named after him.

The Filipinos in Alvarado

Alvarado has had, for many decades, a close relationship with the Filipino people. Looking back through the records I find that the first Filipino citizen recorded in Washington Township was Alexander R. Calante, 19, who was as servant for James Trimingham, an English farmer living in Centerville.

The first recorded appearance of Filipinos in Alvarado was in the 1920 census when 10 Filipinos were reported; in 1930 that number swelled to 32 and in 1940 that number increased to 53 Filipinos.

During this period there was only one name that appeared in consecutive censuses in Alvarado and that name was Roldan (or Raldan). Pedro Roldan appeared in the 1930 census and then again in the 1940 census. In 1930 he was living with Salvador Roldan and in 1940 he was living with Marinciano Roldan.

The first Alvarado Filipino to be mentioned in newspaper articles was Francisco (Frank) Macahilas when his draft classification was printed in the *Oakland Tribune* in November 1940. He was mentioned in the *Alvarado Pioneer* in November 1941 when he donated 2 ½ pounds of linguica to help feed the men who were cleaning up the Alameda Creek bed of brush and debris.

In April 1943 Frank wrote to the Alvarado Pioneer.

"Dear Sir:

I have been on this rock for a year next month and I longed and missed news of our hometown, but I didn't realize this until this day. I think it wise to get hometown news like most of the boys here in Hawaii. I have been in that town (Alvarado) for eight years and it seems to me that it's now my hometown to me. So please send me every copy of the Alvarado Pioneer and I'll certainly appreciate your kindness.

You can count me as one subscriber and let me know the price to subscribe for a year.

Respectfully yours,

Francisco Macahilas, 18th Infantry Co. K, April 12, 1943"

Frank would return to Alvarado after the war and he would become a businessman, opening the New Manila Pool Hall at 1045 Levee Street, just south of the Alvarado Meat Market at Maiden Lane. Here in 1949 his establishment would be raided for alleged illegal gambling, which Mr. Macahilas testified that the games were straight and the house had no take in proceeds other than renting out the tables to gamblers.


