The small factory in Union City, which began processing sugar beets in November 15, 1870, was built in 1870 by E.H. Dyer, "Father of the American Beet Sugar Industry". The factory has been demolished and replaced with housing.

THE PACIFIC COAST SUGAR COMPANY

At 2:30 a.m. on January 30, 1887, the Standard Sugar Company suffered a catastrophic explosion in their boiler room. A fireman on duty tending the boiler was killed. Although there was ample time to fix the damage that the company had suffered, the company decided to forgo the 1887 sugar campaign. Then in June 1887, Ebenezer Dyer purchased the mill for \$125,000, and with an additional \$125,000 in capital, a new mill was built. Capacity would be increased from processing 50 tons of beets daily to 200 tons.

The 1888 campaign for the Pacific Coast Sugar Company would be its first and its last. Numbers about the campaign are not to be found. However, The Daily Alta California of San Francisco of October 1, 1888 wrote that, "the Alvarado beet crop was a failure this season because of an insufficiency of rain."

On January 14, 1889 the Spring Valley Water Company brought suit against the Pacific Coast Sugar Company to acquire and hold the right to take, appropriate and divert the waters of Alameda Creek. The Spring Valley Water Co. of San Francisco had riparian rights to the Alameda Creek Watershed and the Alameda Creek itself from Sunol to the SF Bay. Without water from the Alameda Creek, they would have to sink costly underground wells to survive.

Two weeks later a committee was formed to seek a sale of the Pacific Coast Sugar Company to a buyer. The new mill would be sold to the Alameda Sugar Company of San Francisco.

Ebenezer Dyer would go on to form the E.H. Dyer Company of

Alvarado, California and Cleveland, Ohio. This company would design and build beet sugar processing plants. Ebenezer Dyer would remain in Alvarado and would design the beet sugar mills. Edward and Hugh Dyer would relocate to Cleveland and would work with companies interested in opening beet sugar plants. Besides California, E.H. Dyer & Co. would build plants in Utah, Oregon, Colorado, Michigan and Canada. After a one year contract as a consultant for the Alameda Sugar Company, Ebenezer Dyer no longer had an interest in the Alvarado mill. Next time, the Alameda Sugar Co.

FOUNDER'S NOTES

Let me tell you about the building that the Union City Historical Museum is occupying since the year 2001. It used to be the Alvarado Fire Station. The firehouse went through several building stages. The engine bays were built in 1943, the front office was built in 1948, and the rear sleeping quarters were built in 1962.

The firefighters assigned to this station were an "all volunteer" company until 1964. During that period the Fire Chief, Mr. Elvin Rose, lived approximately one block away from the station. To contact the fire department, a citizen would call the number assigned to the firehouse, which would ring at the Chief's house. The Chief would then push a button to activate the siren on the rooftop of the firehouse, summoning the volunteer firefighters. Another method existed: citizens could push a button located on the front of the firehouse to activate the siren on the rooftop.

In 1964, Union City had enough firefighters to ensure that the Alvarado Station was manned full-time by city staff, and the volunteer department was disbanded. The firehouse was closed in 1984, and remained empty for several years until a Union City Police Officer rented it from the City to use as his residence for a few years. When the officer moved away from Union City, the building remained empty until the Historical Museum occupied it in 2001.
