PACIFIC COAST SUGAR COMPANY IN ALVARADO

This is the old Pacific Coast Sugar Mill built in 1888 by E.H. Dyer and sold to the Alameda Sugar Co. circa 1890. The Alameda Sugar ran this mill until December

1926 when it was sold to the Holly Sugar Co. In 1935, the Holly Sugar Co. built a new metal structure and tore down this old building. You can see from this picture how poorly maintained the facility was and the reason for its destruction.

Behind the building you can see the bare trees of the Alameda Creek and beyond that is visible the town of



Alvarado. The Alvarado Grammar School is barely visible on the far left of photo just above the "ALV" of Alvarado. To the right center at the top of photo is downtown Alvarado.
